#### 90. FDC NEIGHBOURHOOD COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT OFFICER

Report by T Wadsley re progress being made by Fenland Neighbourhood Community team.

- The meeting was advised that a Neighbourhood Community offer has been recruited for Elm and Christchurch and should commence the middle of June.
- The Rural West Wisbech Children's Centre at Murrow School will be officially opened on the 27<sup>th</sup> May between 10.00 and 4.00 pm. The formal opening will take place at 11.00 am. During the day there will be activities for children under 5.
- The Easter activities had gone well and there were similar organised for the May holidays. A new programme is being organised for the summer holidays. There is a Fun day based on health issues on the 31<sup>st</sup> May at Guyhirn Playing Field free to the community from 2.30pm to 5.00pm weather permitting.

#### 91. POLICE MATTERS

Report by the Community Beat Officer

- PC J Coales reported that there had been theft of fuel at Guyhirn, 2 domestic assaults at Thorney Toll and thefts from garden sheds, garden ornaments and vehicles at Wisbech St Mary. At the moment there are a number of thefts from garden sheds in the rural areas and they are being to gain access by unscrewing the hinges and it is recommended that residents reinforce them. The theft of fuel and metal theft appears to be on the decline, but there have a number of thefts of vehicles and theft from vehicles in the Wisbech area.
- The meeting was advised that it is understood that the speed camera in Thorney Toll is to be repaired.
- The meeting was advised that there is a Police Panel meeting at Elm school on the 24<sup>th</sup> June at 7.30 pm.
- A discussion took place in respect of the increase in height of the flood defences in North Brink and the difficulties of traffic with the parked vehicles. It is understood that after this work is complete there may be no parking in North Brink to ease the traffic congestion.

94. **HIGHWAYS AND LIGHTING MATTERS**

- a. CCC regarding Carriageway Surface dressing programme Hooks Drove, Wisbech St Mary and Long Drove, Wisbech St Mary. **Noted.**

**Highways reports from Councillors on problems**

- 1. Overhead lighting not working in Goosetree Road.
- 2. Gull Drove and Gull road junction cannot see as the junction is obscured by trees and heavy brambles.
- 3. Junction of the A47 from Gull Road slip road obscured by trees near the old Railway Inn. This is now a matter of urgency as these are now growing and this is now becoming dangerous.
- 4. Live electric cable across the road near Tall Trees Gull Road.
- 5. 40mph sign to be moved further along Gull Road. This had been agreed to be moved by the FD Neighbourhood Community Development team.
- 6. Hedge and bushes encroaching over the footpath at Manor House, station Road, Wisbech St Mary.
- 7. Lay By Fence on the South side of the A47 outside Redgate Farm Thorney Toll needs repairing, section missing.
- 8. Grass cutting unsatisfactory only cutting 3 ft side of the road.
- 9. Road and footpath flooding outside Walnut Cottage, High Road, Wisbech St Mary. The reason for this is that the root from his garden is blocking the outlet to the sump. This was reported by a CCC Highways representative. Can this please be advised to the resident of Walnut Cottage.
- 10. Pot hole Church Road Sayers Field entrance Wisbech St Mary.
- 11. Posts encroaching on the highway at the white Tudor style house ¼ mile after the Guyhirn sign from Tholomas Drove.
